The Suncoast conservation with Dr. Cathy Gwendyn will be providing programing on fishing and information on fish for kids. Adult programing includes Mexican Dominoes, knitting, Jewelry making class, arts and crafts with herbs and many summer programs for reading as well. Hands only CPR on 5/7 @ 2pm. Basic computer series on 5/3 @ 3pm. Walk-in tech help with tablet, phone, etc. at 530pm on Wednesday afternoon. South Shore has their story times back on Tuesday's at 1030 and 11 am. Success 4 Kids and Families has a waiting list with the promotoras and they will prioritize it based on needs. Counseling only has about 2-3 families on waiting list. Currently busy with Maristela and the Promotora for parenting classes on Thursday mornings - families can take their children. Healthy Transitions is also another program available for 18-24 year old youths at risk. Individuals do not need to have documentation but they do need to have some type of mental health history. Maria McClain with Hispanic Services has 5 new promotoras and they are also conducting classes of Comprando Rico y Sano, with a minimum of 8 students per class. Ms. Claudia announced that she has completed some classes with Enterprising Latinas and she is aking for assistance with food tasting. She brought a cake to share and for us to share comments with her on texture, taste and quality of cake. La Esperanza will have their public hearing on 4/23 at 630pm. The meeting will be at Reddick Elementary and they are inviting families and agencies to show up for support.
